CAMPAIGN & PRECINCT ALERT! VOTER REGISTRATIONS WITH MORE BOUNTY!!

There is more money to be earned for your registered Republican voters. Your area's Republican Assemblymen and Senators and Federal Congressmen are agreeing to give your Club \$1. more for each of their district's newly registered voters.

You will need to call them and introduce yourself as their Federated Women constituents and tell them that the California Republican Party (CRP) will be giving your Federated Club \$3. (on-line submission) for each registered voter. Ask them to consider paying your Club as well. If they say “no,” explain that other elected officials in their district are paying your Club and that they should check with their Assemblyman or Senator or Congressman (their “boss”) to reconsider. My Congressman, David Dreier, will be giving our Club an extra \$1. for each. Arcadia's local Assemblyman Adams (59th District) will also be chipping in \$1. Our Senator Margett's office (District 29) will be giving us a \$1. per form as well. So, it can be done!! You do need to say that other elected officials are doing it so that they can feel the pressure to be a part of the Federated's push to register Republican voters for their District. We work for them and this is one way that they can return a courtesy. When Arcadia totals its bounty \$\$, it comes to \$6./registrant! Now, that's big news! And, the bucks add up!

You will have to make a copy of the Voter Registration Form for each of them for proof. That's all that they'll require from you. And, then send them to them requesting your bounty. Have an *Attn to: Whoever they say...* This is a good way to be connected to their office. Remember, the Los Angeles County Fair will be a great place to gather some voters for your elected officials. Make sure that you write down the important facts (name, address, phone, etc.) for these officials (no copy machines for us there) for proof.

Also, a very sweet and appropriate thing to do would be to keep names, addresses, and phone numbers of ALL THOSE THAT YOU REGISTER THAT DAY AT THE FAIR and pass them along to your “sister” clubs for membership. You can send them directly or send them to me and I'll send them to a Club in the area of residence and boost up our total County membership, especially before the cut-off of October 22.

We can all help each other. Let's do it for our Party!! We have a lot to do before the BIG ELECTION!

ON THE BLACKBOARD

Coming elections will determine the course of the United States for years to come. It is imperative that we educate ourselves to the major issues facing the nation and support people we can trust. Perfection will not be found in any candidate. Consideration must be given to a candidate's record, his abilities and drawbacks, his commitment to what is best for the country and also, his elect ability. Republicans have many candidates to evaluate, who seem superior to the Democratic candidates. Please work hard to elect your choices, and don't forget, they need financial support and volunteers.

Radical Preparation

Are students in our schools and colleges getting lessons in history and citizenship? A recent anti-war rally in Washington was composed mostly of young people, thought of Gen. Petraeus, she responded that he was not telling the truth because he was a "coward." Obviously, she knew nothing about his Bronze Star for valor, his long years of active military service in defense of the U.S. She compared the war on terrorism to Vietnam. Did Vietnamese bomb the U.S. and murder 3,000 innocents? Did Vietnamese leaders threaten to kill all non-Muslims unless they would convert to Islam or be second-class citizens paying high taxes to exist? This young woman got her "education" from teachers who are anti-war and anti-American. How long will we allow such bias to be taught in our schools and colleges? The former Vietnam protestors are now university professors who want to repeat anti-war protests, riots and arrest to achieve a Vietnam-like retreat from Iraq. They must not succeed.

Language Lessons

Gov. Arnold stirred up anger in some communities when he advised that if Hispanic students want to improve their class scores, "You've got to turn off the Spanish TV set." He knew

from experience that speaking English helps you get ahead in our country. However, Democratic Party presidential candidates sent a different message when they gave their speeches in Spanish to gain votes. "Don't bother learning English. We'll speak your language." This is unprecedented pandering.

Media Turnoff

Newspapers are losing subscribers. TV viewers dropped by 2.5 million people in the last few months. The mainstream media cannot pinpoint the reasons. Maybe part of it results from the same liberal bias repeated by shows and comics, by slanted headlines, political correctness and omission of positive news stories. A survey indicates that Americans are no better informed today on national and international affairs than those polled in 1989. I watch the Fox News Channel and get information not broadcast by ABC, NBC or CBS. Start examining your newspaper. Note what is placed on the front page. You can make a difference by calling the editors of your paper or station. I have gotten some results. Calls are, in my opinion, more effective than letters to the Editor, which usually are not printed. But keep trying. The media is finally getting worried.

Charter Standards

For years, charter schools have lacked consistent standards and policies for renewal. The LAUSD has allowed politics to influence its decisions. For example, Ivy Academia, a high-performing, independent charter school, was granted only a one-year extension of its charter. In sharp contrast, Academia Semillas, which performs in the lowest 10% statewide, was given the standard five-year renewal, overruling staff recommendations. The approval was due to the pressure of the school's 1,000 supporters who attended the LAUSD Board meeting. If local districts cannot operate responsibly, the state must step in and set reasonable standards for all charter renewals and operations.

THE “FORGOTTEN MAN”

AN UNFORGETTABLE BOOK – ONE THAT I URGE YOU TO READ

I love the study of history, particularly when it’s conveyed by someone who really has a grasp of his (or, in this case, her) subject matter. I have just read one of the best books that I have ever read (and I’m a voracious reader). The book is entitled the *Forgotten Man: A New History of the Great Depression*, and the author, a woman of transcendent brilliance (and, in so describing her, I may be selling her short), is Amity Shlaes. The book is a revisiting of the period preceding and including the great depression – one of the most important economic periods in our history, and the defining period in terms of where we find ourselves today, i.e. with a looming welfare state. Lest you think I am alone in my assessment of Ms. Shlaes’ skills, permit me to quote from a review by Steven F. Hayward (another author whom I enjoy) in the July 30th issue of *National Review*:

This new book is the finest history of the Great Depression ever written. Hold on – this is supposed to be a review, not a dust-jacket blurb, but it can’t be helped. Although there are several fine revisionist works about the Great Depression and the New Deal, Shlaes’s achievement stands out for the devastating effect of its understated prose and for its wide sweep of characters and themes. It deserves to become the preeminent revisionist history for general readers.

Normally, I would say that’s almost a bit over the top; I have read few books that justify this sort of extravagant praise. However, in this case, Mr Hayward has, if anything, understated the case. The *Forgotten Man* is, quite simply, history at its best. Through Ms. Shlaes’s effort you are not left to just study history; rather, you are given the opportunity to experience it. In her hands, and through her efforts, you are transported back to that very important and lively period in our history. Indeed, it can reasonably be argued that no period has played a greater role in giving what may prove to be permanent shape to America’s evolution. As I read this marvelous piece of literature (just calling it history doesn’t do it justice – that’s how absorbing it is), for the first time in my life (in the case of nonfiction) I felt like I was actually being introduced to the characters that played such a vital role in this epic period.

Ms. Shlae’s sees FDR as impulsive, mercurial, almost whimsical in dealing with the troubled times over which he presided. His policies often seemed as changeable as the weather and almost as predictable; it was as if he was guided by some alien force, in addition to a battery of bright, but not always effective, consultants drawn from various walks of life (many from the professoriate – the beginning of our over reliance on people from the academy – people who frequently studied life more than they lived it). Many of these had gone to Russia to observe the great experiment that followed the Bolshevik revolution and were greatly affected by their experience there. But it was Roosevelt who called the shots, even when he appeared to have little command of either the subject matter or the appropriate course of action. FDR was a triumph of personality and politics over policy. Indeed, his personality was his politics,

and, because it was such a winning personality and the times so turbulent, he was able to seek, and was given, an inordinate amount of power – power which, on many occasions, he used inappropriately, thereby both prolonging and deepening the great depression (the DOW, one of the 2 economic indicators on which Ms. Shlaes places great reliance – the other the unemployment figures – did not regain its 1929 position until the early ‘50s, a period of almost a quarter of a century).

While Hoover handled the initial stages of the Depression as badly as FDR managed it thereafter, I don’t believe that he could have done so for the same length of time – while all indications are that he was much smarter than FDR, he did not have FDR’s commanding presence. And that presence was greatly enhanced by a relatively new medium – radio, and FDR was to radio what Jack Kennedy was to television. Some of my earliest political recollections were those of my parents huddled around the radio on the occasion of an FDR fireside chat.

In any event, the book is worthwhile for the view it provides of FDR, if for no other reason (and there are many other reasons). But FDR is the compelling figure of the depression in the same manner that he is the compelling figure of WWII - how often is a president presented with the opportunity to preside over 2 of the most cataclysmic events of the century in which he holds office? Actually, in FDR’s case, this was a stroke of good luck, for he needed the second cataclysm to rescue him from his clumsy handling of the first.

The recurrent failing of FDR was his almost constitutional inability to provide a measure of certainty; he almost comes across as an upbeat Mississippi Gambler, ready to experiment in these troubling times without the slightest clue as to how the experiment might turn out. With Roosevelt, politics always seemed to trump policy, and, as noted, politics, to FDR, was personality. And, in this area he was truly gifted – his voice, manner, and warmth had a reassuring quality that inspired confidence – fortunately (for him) the public had no idea of how little he knew as to where his policies were taking the country. FDR’s approach to policy was better heard than seen; it almost reminds you of that old advice about sausages, i.e. if you like them, you should not watch them being made.

The economic message of the New Deal period that Ms. Shlaes pounds home is the need for certainty – a need that FDR never met, thereby worsening and extending the country’s woes. And Ms. Shlaes acknowledges the difficulty of bringing this fact to light because of the left’s virtual idolatry of FDR. And, while her portrait of FDR is less than flattering, it is eminently fair. She is no kinder to Herbert Hoover. The point here is that Ms. Shlaes is, to my way of thinking, a true scholar. I really can’t tell whether she’s a Republican or a Democrat (I’d like to think that she’s a Republican because of the obvious brilliance she displays, and I just can’t imagine that kind of logic and clarity emanating from a Democrat – however, I read somewhere that she considers herself a liberal; if so, then she is a liberal in the classical sense), and I really don’t care. Whatever her political

MY BOOK SHELF

This past year Lt. Col. Patterson was the guest speaker at one of our Los Angeles County Republican Party Central Committee meetings. Having bought and read his book, “Dereliction of Duty”, I was eager to meet him, hear him and buy his latest book, hence this book report!

Patterson is no hard line partisan as he was born into a family of Southern Democrats. He once carried the “nuclear football” for Bill Clinton, so he was able to watch up close as Clinton amassed his record of failure and irresponsibility on national security matters. In this book he shows conclusively that the Democrats never focus on America’s enemies. Instead, they always assume the enemy is us: America, our armed services, and our intelligence operations.

Patterson demonstrates that the liberal Democrats would still have us believe that 9/11 was an anomaly, and that we can return to preventing terrorism through law enforcement rather than military action -- the official policy of the Clinton administration

Patterson also details how liberals are still deluded enough to believe that we’ll be safer if we transfer responsibility for fighting terrorism to the United Nations. These ideas are perpetuated since the Carter and Clinton administrations.

Here are a few of Buzz Patterson’s explosive disclosures:

- The shocking reason why we didn’t have “actionable” intelligence on al Qaeda and the threat from Osama before September 11, 2001 -- *and how it directly implicates the Democrat Party*

persuasion, she is possessed of one of the best minds that I have encountered, and her writing skills are superb. I have never been so engrossed with a piece of history, and I was a history major (for at least the first 2 years of college – at a time when history professors taught rather than proselytized). But it is not just FDR that Ms. Shlaes connects you with like no other I’ve seen; she brings the entire New Deal cast of characters, as well as those that preceded it, into your life in much the same manner as if they walked across a stage in your living room and personally introduced you to their thinking as to the incredible problems that they were called upon to deal with and the terrible conditions that gave rise to those problems. You will never have a greater introduction, and/or insight, into that period than the one

- The briefing paper given to Clinton in 1996 that described al Qaeda plot to employ commercial airliners as weapons -- and Clinton’s calculating, politicized, and ultimately ineffectual response
- How anti-war liberals and partisans of the American left “reformed” our intelligence services to the point of impotency
- Clinton’s legacy: the most extreme and ill-advised defense reductions in our nation’s history, the devastation of military morale across all branches of the armed forces, and, through his philandering and unscrupulous behavior, the complete abdication of his moral authority to lead men and women in uniform
- Inaction, indecisiveness, and risk aversion: how these became hallmarks of Clinton’s response to terrorism
- Shocking incidents Patterson witnessed first hand that demonstrated Clinton’s general indifference to the growing problem of global Islamic terrorism
- How today’s Democrat Party is socially liberal to the point of social decadence

Patterson proves that we can no longer trust the Democrat Party with our nation’s security. Would there be any difference in a Hillary Clinton presidency than her husband? received by virtue of making the journey through this work of unparalleled excellence. While the picture of FDR is unflattering, at least in terms of his management (or I should say his mismanagement) of the economy, these facts were well known to me before I had ever heard of Ms. Shlaes. There are a number of fine works on this period, two of the best of which are FDR’s Folly: How Roosevelt and His New Deal Prolonged the Great Depression by Jim Powell (Crown Forum 2003) and Rethinking the Great Depression: A New View of Its Causes and Consequences by Gene Smiley (Ivan R, Dee, 2002), both excellent reads. I thoroughly enjoyed both of these books and found them incredibly illuminating. However, The Forgotten Man is different; it is in a class by itself – this is history with a soul.
