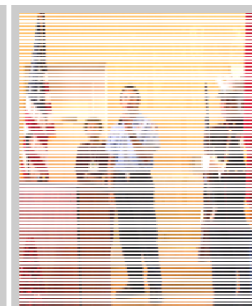

## REPORT ON THE NFRW COMBINED REGIONAL 70TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION OF LEADERSHIP AND TRAINING

Las Vegas Nov.14-15, 2008

NFRW and the Nevada FRW hosts who gave 100+ attendees this marvelous educational experience are to be congratulated. I wish it had been videotaped to share with everyone, for there was so much content it was difficult to absorb it all. But from my notes:

The First Lady of Nevada, **Dawn Gibbons**, welcomed us, followed by a dynamic PowerPoint Membership Workshop presentation by **Tonya Stiel** – a name we should all remember. How Tonya turned a fading small Federated club (Franklin, Louisiana) in a township of 7,000 people where 14 women showed up for meetings, into a community force of 144, is a story that inspired us all. Her methods to recruit and retain were creative and effective. Later, she also presented a Fundraising Workshop. Using her methods, her club raised over \$100,000 in a 14 month period! Watch Tonya go!

Her traveling NFRW spokesperson **Jessie Morton** was the Legislation guru, explaining how hot issues can bring members to your organization. Her examples were *Jessica’s Law* and *Katie’s Law* (DNA testing upon arrest).

On Saturday, the **Rev. Wayne Perryman** shook us up as he pointed out how we Republicans have allowed the Democrat Party to rob us of our political heritage: Do young people know Lincoln was a Republican? That Abolitionist Republicans were hung alongside blacks by Ku Klux Klan members (Democrats of that day)? We Republicans own the civil rights history of America. He had so many examples; we were fired up to tell the world – especially the young – of our fine political heritage. He

also had an extensive book signing for the several books he has written on the subject.

Then there was the Leadership workshop by professional motivational speaker **Jane Strain**, who condensed what would have been at least a day long Leadership session in a corporate setting to one hour of inspiration, examples and instruction. Wow! **Mary Lou Terranova**, LACFRW president, and I, 2009 incoming president, felt we were in Leadership heaven. There wasn’t one sentence that was not powerful and memorable. She reminded us that Jesus Christ was a leader, and George Patton, but also Hitler and Karl Marx. Leadership in and of itself is neither good nor bad – it’s what you do with it! (As we witness the Obama spectacle).

NFRW Membership Initiative chairperson **Joyce Smith** explained the new IMI program, and offered to help leaders in various ways. It’s good to know NFRW has chairpersons as strong and qualified as Joyce.

I can’t say one of the more interesting sessions, because the sessions have all been fascinating, but an excellent presentation was given by a professional psychological corporate therapist, **Kathy King**, “Recruiting across Generations” where we got the psychological lowdown on how to reach women of different generations. For instance, Baby Boomers tend to be more permissive (than earlier generations) and also more strongly tied to the workforce. You motivate the Baby

## ON THE BLACKBOARD

### ELECTION AFTERMATH

The voters have spoken. Many of us gave our all to elect a Republican ticket. We need to regroup and prepare for the 2010 election. We have to explain our policies better. Our country's future is at stake. God bless the U.S.A.

### EMIGRATION DROP

As estimated 814,000 Mexicans emigrated to the U.S. in 2007, compared to 1.2 million in 2006; why the drop? Tighter border controls and raids against illegal migrants had an effect. Today our troubled economy may spur many to return to Mexico. This hurts the Mexican budget, whose second-largest source of foreign income is the money Mexican workers in the U.S. send home. Incredible!

### EDUCATION CUTS

Our state deficit is estimated at between \$5 - \$10 billion. The Governor warns that LAUSD may be cut by \$440 million, possibly resulting in a shorter school year and layoffs. Superintendent Brewer said 83% of its budget is spent on payroll. Ways to cut non-essential spending may include a hiring freeze for all non-teaching positions and eliminating teacher recruitment. Also eliminated might be consultant contracts, professional development contracts, travel and meeting expenses.

It's about time! LAUSD spends almost \$215,000 each on 849 consultants to oversee school construction. Regular employees earn \$99,000 each. "Consultants constitute about 20% of division personnel and 35% of personnel costs." This is only one example of exorbitant waste. Why do voters keep passing school bonds?

### DROP OUT CRISIS

Schools are failing to educate our children and cannot even keep them in school. Nationwide, 1 out of 4 students drop out of school, (minority students make up 1 in 3.) The CA Education Dept. reports 127,292 students quit school last year. More than 1/3 of LAUSD pupils drop out. Under No Child Left Behind, states can set their own graduation targets, and have lowered standards. Still, the dropouts continue. Business and college leaders complain that students are not prepared for the work force or college. Where will we get our leaders? Young people who voted for Obama were interviewed and failed the simplest questions about our history, government and country.

### CHARTER SCHOOLS

Some parents feel charter schools are the answer. They are independent of LAUSD, have their own budgets, their own Board of Directors and vary considerably in effectiveness and curriculum. Dept. Supt. Cortines plans to open 5 shuttered schools to use for the charters. The unions and some neighbors are displeased. Board Member Korenstein argues that the charter schools do not have as many special-ed students as regular schools, which affects test scores. They have fewer students, often less than 500. The District loses state attendance money for each child who attends a charter school, totaling about \$300 million a year. She advocates expanding magnet schools.

Fellow Republicans, we must become active monitors of our education system if we are to survive as a free nation. Visit your local schools and colleges. Speak out.

## ONE WOMAN'S OPINION

**B**rowsing my favorite website, FreeRepublic.com, I found that one of my fellow "Freepers" had posted information from another website, TruthOrFiction.com, under the heading "Uranium Yellowcake Found in Iraq." After accessing the TruthOrFiction website, and reading the story I decided to share it with readers of my One Woman's Opinion column. **THE TRUTH NEEDS TO BE KNOWN!**

The article has two versions of the e-Rumors that were posted on the internet on this subject the summer of 2008. The summary of the rumors is that several news agencies reported that radio active concentrates of uranium known as "Yellowcake" were secretly transported from Iraq to Canada. The article is under the heading of: **URANIUM YELLOWCAKE FOUND IN IRAQ – TRUTH**

TruthOrFiction.com, a non-partisan website, writes that according to published reports (CBS News included) "The United States secretly moved a huge stockpile of yellowcake from Iraq to Canada" in early August, 2008. The

operation "reportedly took three months to execute" and was more than a year in the planning. The article continues by telling that the operation was carried out by moving 3,500 barrels of yellowcake, by road, from Baghdad. They were put aboard 37 military flights and flown to an atoll in the Indian Ocean. They were then put "aboard a United States ship bound for Montreal." More than 500 tons of material from Saddam Hussein's nuclear program were sold by the Iraqi government to a Canadian uranium company for use in nuclear reactors in Ontario, Canada. "American troops found the 550 metric tons of uranium in 2003 after invading Iraq." It was kept secret, and guarded by our military "for fear of terrorists attempting to steal it."

For five years the liberal media, Valerie Plame, and her husband Joe Wilson, have trumpeted "Bush lied!" "As it turns out, that the people who lied were Joe Wilson and his wife."
